Computer Productivity Workshop

If a computer is your stock tool of trade, then your productivity probably depends on your proficiency with Microsoft software. From the ubiquitous Windows operating systems to the inescapable Office suite of programs, Microsoft products play a fundamental role in everyday computing, but they can cause an inordinate share of headaches as well. This workshop will offer practical advice that will help you avoid those headaches, improve your efficiency, troubleshoot particular problems, and enhance your computer skills in general.

Led by computer consultant Gale Rhoades, this interactive workshop will cover material of interest to both PC and Mac users, experienced and beginning indexers, and those in fields outside indexing, such as editing and technical writing.

Workshop attendees are encouraged to submit questions or topics beforehand, so that Gale can tailor her presentation accordingly.

GALE RHOADES is the North American publisher of the Macrex indexing program. Since 1991 she has been selfemployed as a computer consultant, working with individuals, small businesses, and municipalities; her client base now extends far beyond the San Francisco Bay Area in which she lives. She developed many of her skills and techniques during the ten years she served as executive director of the nonprofit Fog International Computer Users Group, where she coordinated the activities of volunteers and employees and served as the teacher who manages to stay just one step ahead of the students. Indexers--especially Macrex users-often benefit from her extensive (and freely shared) knowledge of hardware, software, and peripherals. She offers four principles for successful computer usage: Try before you buy; backups are needed only when they don't exist; if you can't solve a problem in five minutes, seek assistance; and the only "dumb" question is the one not asked.

Panel on indexer websites: Nancy Guenther, Becky Hornyak, and Enid Zafan will talk about content, design and designers, webhosts, and other matters related to marketing your indexing business with a website.

Nancy Guenther is our chapter webmaster and maintains a number of websites. She's been indexing since 1983 and lives in southeastern Pennsylvania. Enid Zafran has a website for her business and thoughts about what ought to be included and what should be avoided. Her company, Indexing Partners, has been providing indexing services since 1989. She lives in Delaware. Becky Hornyak also has a website and is a candidate for chapter office. (see page 3)

Merge onto I-95 N toward Baltimore / College Park. 16.2 miles Merge onto MD-32 W via Exit 38B toward Columbia. 1.9 miles Take the Broken Land Parkway North exit-Exit 14- toward Owen Brown. 0.3 miles Merge onto Broken Land Parkway. <0.1 miles Turn slight right onto Snowden River Parkway. 1.2 miles Take the Robert Fulton Drive ramp. 0.2 miles Turn slight right onto Robert Fulton Drive. 0.8 miles

As you face the building, use the door on the right.

Directions from the North: South on I-95 toward past Baltimore Exit at Route 100 West toward Ellicott City Exit to Snowden River Parkway At the circle at the bottom of the ramp go ³/₄ of the way around (like a left turn) You'll go through 6 traffic lights (at Waterloo Rd., Tamar Dr., Dobbin Road, Rt. 175 [2 lights there] and McGaw Rd. Stay in the right lane to exit onto Robert Fulton Drive.

8621 is nearly a mile down Robert Fulton on the right.
